
Cambridge Exam Result

Formative Assessment 2 & PTM

Formative Assessment 2 for Grades 6 to A Level was conducted from 13th to 23rd August 2025. The assessments aimed to evaluate students' conceptual understanding, application skills, and consistent learning progress across all subjects. Teachers have provided detailed feedback and identified areas for improvement to help students enhance their performance in the upcoming term. The Parent–Teacher Meeting (PTM) for the same is scheduled for 6th September 2025. This session will provide parents with an opportunity to review their ward's academic progress, discuss strengths and developmental areas, and work collaboratively with teachers to ensure optimal learning outcomes.

Career Counselling for students in TGWS

The Beyond Mentor Career Counselling Programme was organised at TGWS for students in Grades 9-12 from August 5 to August 9, 2025.

The programme began with an Orientation Session for the students, featuring a PowerPoint presentation that provided an overview of career counselling, self-discovery, and exploring various career options. On August 5 and 6, 2025, a Psychometric Test, a scientific method to measure students' aptitudes, interests, and strengths, was conducted. Grade 9 students participated in a session focused on self-assessment, exploring options, and setting goals. From August 7 to 9, Individual Career Counselling Sessions for Grade 10 students and Group Sessions for Grades 11, 12, AS, and A Level students were held.

The career counsellors engaged students in various activities aimed at helping them explore career options, identify their interests, and develop essential skills. Discussions took place between













parents and counsellors, providing insights into students' aspirations and encouraging exploration. Open communication was promoted to aid decision-making, and the performance of students in the Psychometric Test was also discussed. On the final day, an Entrance Pathway Discussion was held for students in Grades 10 and 12. Students from both the Cambridge and CBSE streams attended an insightful session titled "Entrance Exam Pathway Session After 12th," designed to guide them through the wide array of opportunities available after school.

The session "Know Your Options" encouraged students to reflect on the various choices before them. An interactive discussion addressed a critical question: "What if I write them, and why?" This prompted participants to consider the value and purpose of attempting various entrance exams. Experts then categorized entrance exams by field, enabling students to clearly identify pathways aligned with careers in engineering, medicine, law, management, and other professional domains. The discussion also covered international entrance exams, shedding light on opportunities abroad and the preparation strategies necessary for success. One of the most engaging segments helped students understand "How to Choose the Right Exam," equipping them with practical decision-making frameworks based on their interests, aptitudes, and long-term career goals. Overall, the event proved to be a valuable resource for students facing important academic decisions, leaving them better informed and more confident about their future choices.

Parent Talk




