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The GeeKay World School celebrated Teachers' Day with great enthusiasm. The event was a testament to the deep respect for the educators.

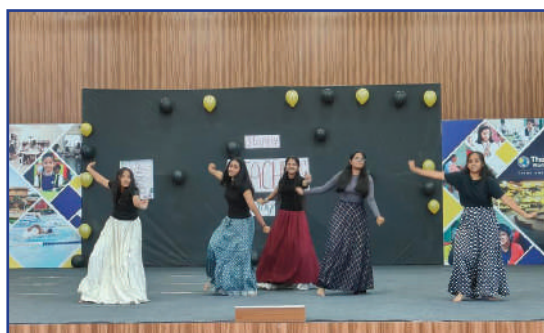
The IIMUN Vellore Chapter was an exciting event that brought together over 180 enthusiastic student delegates from various schools.

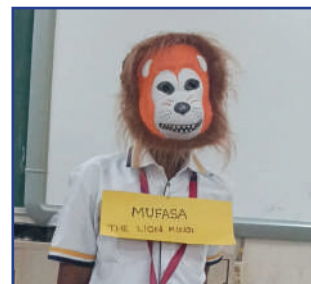

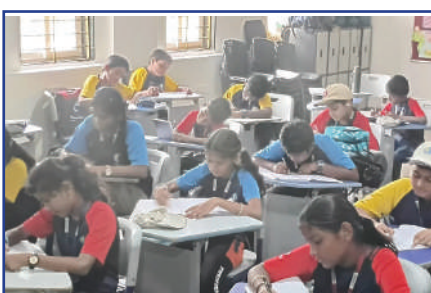
Grade 6 students crafted their own poems, exploring themes through rhythm, imagery, and emotion. Their creativity shone through their poetic expressions.

Secondary World Suicide Prevention Day 2025

Changing the Narrative on Suicide

The GeeKay World School in Ranipet successfully hosted an important event centred around suicide prevention on September 15, 2025, aimed at raising awareness and providing support to students. This year's theme focused on the significance of "Changing the narrative surrounding suicide" and transforming our perceptions of this complex issue. The event attracted a diverse and engaged audience, including teachers, students, and our distinguished guest was Ms. Fay Samuel, a professional in the field



of psychology.

The event underscored the critical importance of addressing mental health challenges. The central session concentrated on essential aspects of suicide awareness, equipping students with valuable insights into recognising and addressing warning signs of suicidal thoughts and behaviours. Key topics discussed included expressions of suicidal thoughts, feelings of helplessness and hopelessness, sudden mood changes, social withdrawal, and changes in eating and sleeping patterns.

Beyond the cognitive aspects, the session offered practical tools for assessing suicidality, focusing on the ideation, intent, and planning stages. A comprehensive discussion explored various risk and protective factors, such as previous suicide attempts, a history of childhood trauma, major life transitions, and the availability of support systems. This information was crucial for understanding the complexity of suicidality and its contributing factors. The session also emphasised the importance of developing a safety plan for individuals at risk of suicide. This plan serves as a vital resource during times of crisis and includes key components such as emergency contacts, including the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, the Crisis Text Line, and local emergency services.

Students were empowered with the message that suicide is preventable, highlighting the need for better access to care and support for those dealing with mental health issues. The key takeaway from the day was that by creating an environment of care, support, and empathy, we can save lives and foster a world worth living in.

Additionally, the initiative aimed to develop guidelines for teachers to identify students at risk of developing mental health concerns. Students participated by inflating balloons and writing the names of their most trustworthy friends with whom they can share their mental challenges. Overall, the event not only provided valuable information but also reinforced the commitment of all involved to support those in need and prevent suicide.

Secondary - Quarterly & Halfyearly Exam

AirCRAFT Design Technology Workshop

The Bharat Space Education and Research Centre organised an online workshop on September 14, 2025, aimed at helping students understand the aircraft design process. The workshop covered topics ranging from the concept phase to the preliminary analysis of aerodynamic forces, including lift, drag, and airfoil performance. Participants also engaged in practical flight demonstrations and an Aircraft Maintenance Programme featuring conceptual experiments. Three of our students, K. Harshan (Grade 12), D. Mirudhula (Grade 11), and Sankeerth Reddy (Grade 11) participated in the workshop and gained insights into standard atmospheric conditions, flight velocities, basic wing geometry calculations, as well as principles of stability and equilibrium for flight safety.

Dr. T. G. Sitharam, Chairman of AICTE, shared valuable insights on Space Education and Technology, highlighting the range of courses developed by AICTE that offer significant opportunities for both students and faculty. During the workshop, former Governor Shri Shekar Dutt underscored the importance of inquiry and the pursuit of solutions to unresolved technological challenges. The event concluded with remarks from Shri G. Harikrishnan, Director of the CBPO office at ISRO, who emphasised the importance of advanced drone technology.

WHY MEN ARE ALWAYS LEFT BEHIND?

Over the past couple of decades, society has increasingly focused on women's empowerment. However, I ask you to consider the plight of men as well. While it is understandable that women have endured significant hardships throughout history, it doesn't make sense to concentrate solely on women's issues while overlooking men.

Take the well-known tragedy of the Titanic, for example. In that incident, women and children were prioritised for lifeboats, while men were left behind. This not only highlights gender discrimination but also illustrates how infrequently we discuss this specific issue. Bringing this into the present, consider the Pahalgam attack that occurred a few months ago. This incident not only revealed religious tensions but also indirectly demonstrated how women were once again protected, while men were not.

I want to clarify that I am not against women's empowerment. I firmly believe that men deserve equal rights and opportunities as women do. Men often feel pressured to be the "man of the house," which can severely impact their mental health. It is crucial to recognise that, while some men have caused significant harm to women, we should not stereotype all men, but rather focus on the positive aspects. Men typically do not express their emotions as openly as women do. This tendency not only reflects their perceived strength but also indicates their ability to hide their feelings. 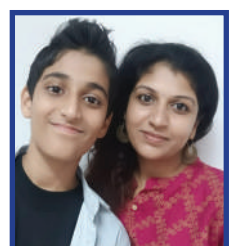
Parent Talk

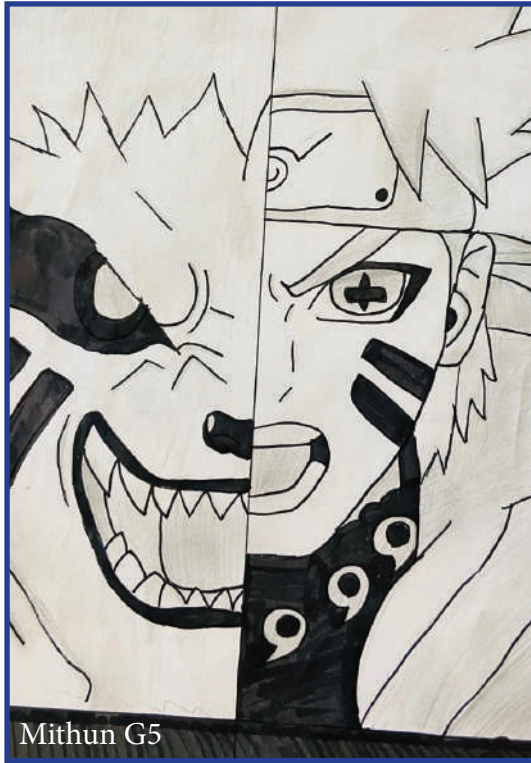

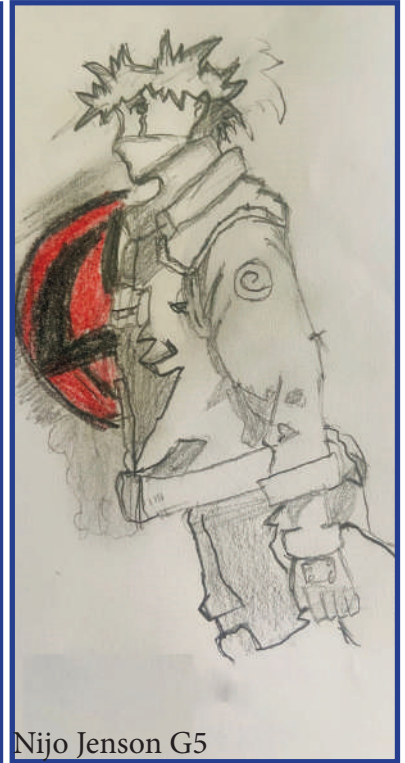
