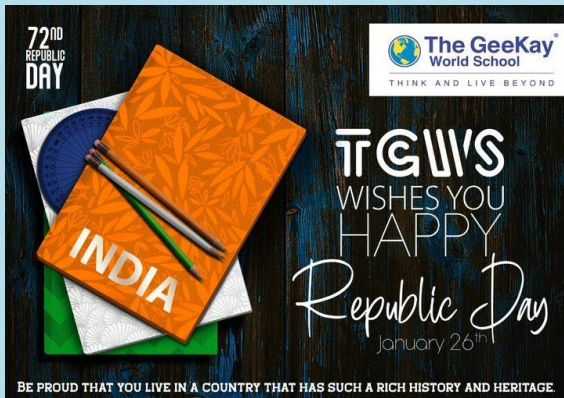
India's 72nd Republic Day on TGWS' digital platform

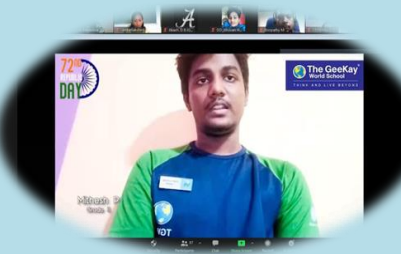
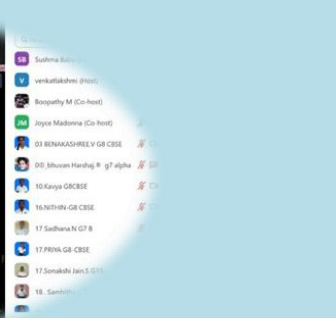
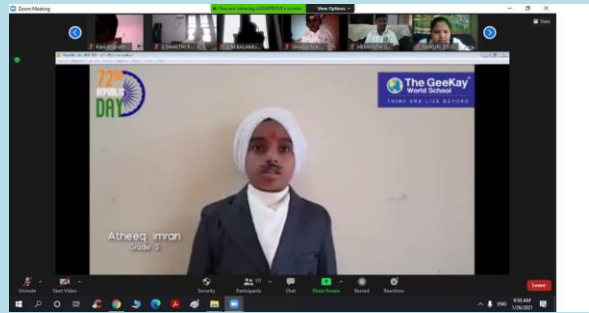
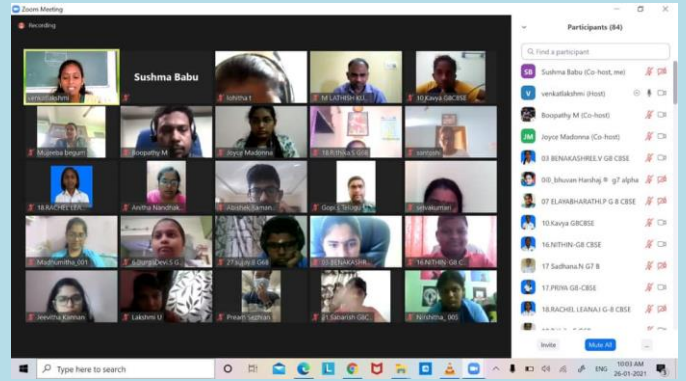

Colour of the Month – White

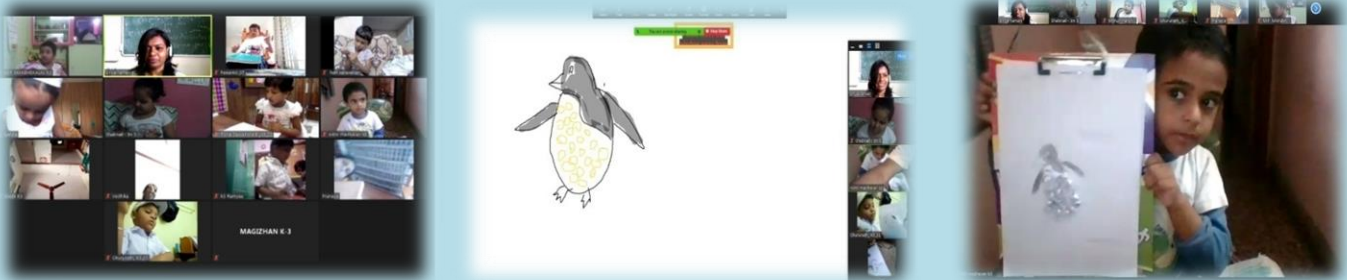

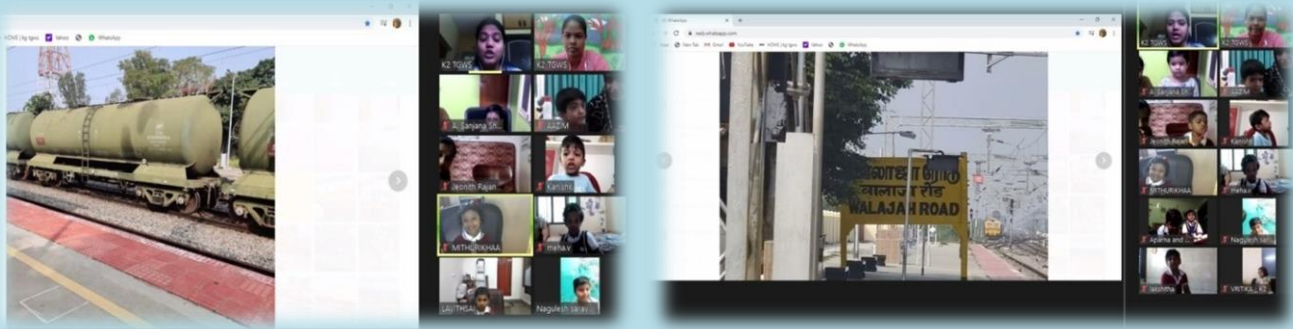

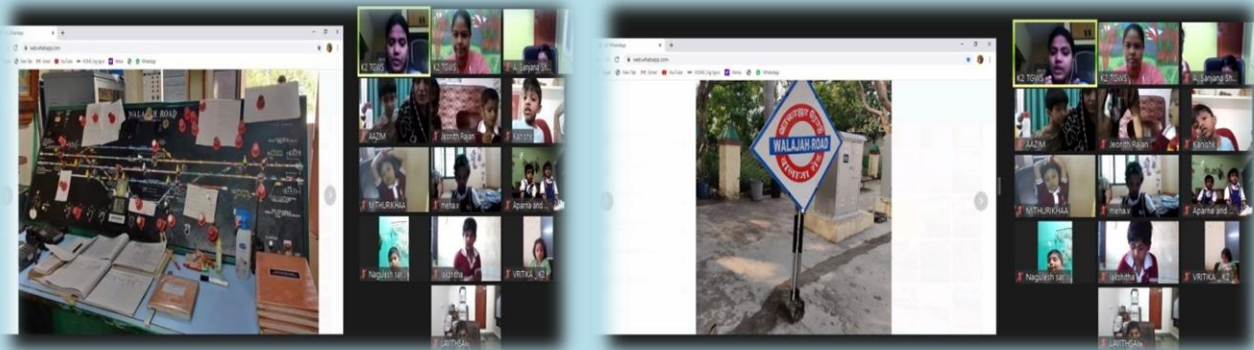

Virtual field trip-Visit to railway station k2

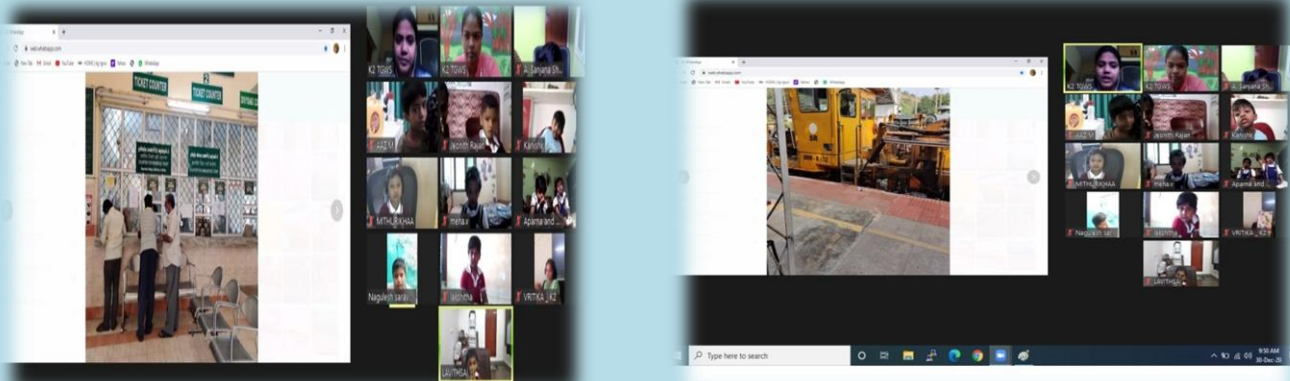

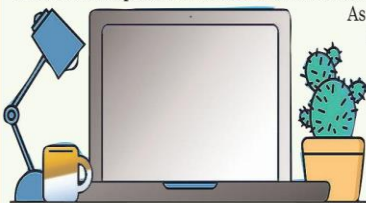


News Release

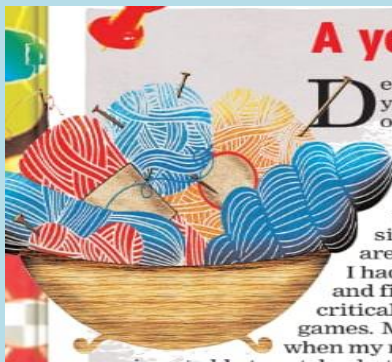
A year full of delight
